The General Data Protection Regulations that come into force on 25 May, 2018 have been causing confusion and anxiety amongst schools and their support staff.

While no-one would argue with the idea that schools should be focusing on teaching children rather than tackling another admin job, the fact remains that GDPR is not just here to stay but is a potential minefield for the unprepared. It also threatens big fines for those who don't comply.

As well as analysing the data they hold, making sure every name on every database is happy to be there and ensuring they only use that data within the new rules, schools have another challenge. They need to appoint a "suitably qualified and experienced" data protection officer (DPO).

What's more, this is not a job that can be added to the workload of the school's business manager. The DPO is responsible for monitoring the school's compliance with the regulations, and that clearly can't be done by the same person

who is responsible for the systems being monitored. And if you think the headteacher has the time to take it on, think again.
